April is another busy month in the library! Read on to find out about events, talks, children's holiday activities, new courses, the latest fundraising news and more.


Finally - an early notice of closure of the library on Thursday 2nd May. The venue will be used as a Polling Station on that day.




The competition will be open to children in two age categories between 4 to 7 years old, and 8 to 11 years old.

Parents/carers – please add the child's name and age and your contact email written clearly on the back of the poster.








TALK ON THE HISTORY AND CULTURE OF HONG KONG 7:30pm THURSDAY 11TH APRIL



The workshops are free so why not invest an hour of your time in these vital life skills?


PAUSE IN THE MACMILLAN WELFARE BENEFITS SERVICE AT THE LIBRARY:

Macmillan Welfare Benefits Service in conjunction with Citizens Advice Bureau has been providing free one to one fortnightly sessions with specialist advisers in the library since June 2023. This is specifically aimed at people living with cancer including their families and carers.

This service is being paused for two months commencing April in order to recruit and train a replacement adviser as the current adviser is reducing her hours.



BOOK REVIEW

Recommended by Rosemary Norman, Volunteer and Poet

Ben Lerner: The Hatred of Poetry: Fitzcarraldo Editions, 2016



Fitzcarraldo books are beautiful, white and blue with what I've just learned are called French flaps, stiff paper covers folded like the flaps on a hardback jacket. I bought this because I couldn't resist the title.

It's a funny book, at least to begin with, because there's something funny about our approach to poetry. I don't know if they use the expression "sheer poetry" in the U.S. but that seems to be what we want, transcendent, breaking the bounds of language and communication. And we can't have it.


Lerner quotes Keats's Ode on a Grecian Urn, "Heard melodies are sweet, but those unheard / Are sweeter". And he looks in detail at William McGonagall's dreadful The Tay Bridge Disaster, a huge and hilarious gap between what's attempted and what's achieved. Less to laugh at later looking at Claudia Rankine, whose task as a poet is to give a readership who may not share it, a sense of her experience as a black American woman.


The poetry world wouldn't agree, but I think the many people who aren't interested in poetry are mostly none the worse for that. This book isn't for them.
