



Three Wives & The Truth is a sideways look at the career of a fictional country singer from Texas



BOOK REVIEW

The Last Hundred Years By Jane Smiley

I discovered this trilogy quite by chance in Northfields Community Library and found it almost addictive. There are three volumes and unfortunately I started with volume 2 then 3, and finally 1 but you really should read them in the right order. The first one is called "Some Luck", the second "Early Warning", and the last one, with some irony, "Golden Age".

The books relate the lives of the Langdon family, descendants of Irish and German immigrants to America, where they farm in rural lowa. The first volume starts in 1920 and ends in 1953 and the remaining two divide the rest of the 100 years roughly in half, ending in 2020. Each volume contains a family tree which I found essential because the novels deal with most of the members of the family, some in far more detail than others.

You will either have lived through or know about many of the historical events that Smiley describes and I found that very interesting, but she is also excellent when she writes about children, even babies. Her adult characters evoke all emotions from compassion to disgust but they are all very real. Her description of the harshness of rural lowa between the wars gave me rather a different view of America, but Smiley takes us further afield. From the east to the west coasts.
